Parade Company and PNC Partner for Grow Up Great Program



Because of our focus on Detroit schools and young students, it is always a privilege for us to be involved with organizations focusing on educational opportunities for early childhood education.

The Parade Company, in partnership with PNC Bank, has committed to presenting [added value](#) to the support the Foundation provides to teachers participating in Grow Up Great, the early childhood program offering students in 30 Detroit classrooms in eight schools enhanced exposure to science and the arts.

The pre-K teachers from these schools received training and an Educator Guide, teaching the science of parade float building, that they can bring into their classrooms. Coinciding with the Educator Guides are Parent Guides so students can continue their learning journey at home through activities that can be replicated with recycled materials and household items.

Also as part of this program, Grow Up Great students were able to [tour the Parade Company studios](#), where float preparation is well underway, and their handprints will go on a PNC Grow Up Great float, to be unveiled November 4th, that will travel down Woodward Avenue on Thanksgiving Day.

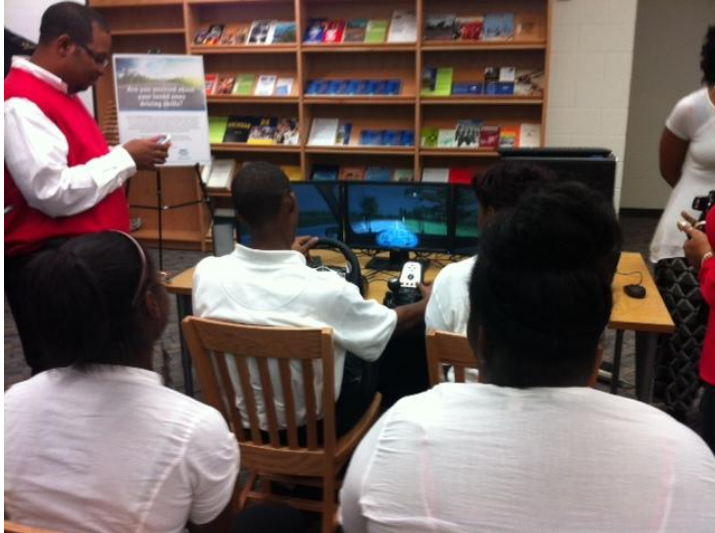
Golightly Career and Technical Center's Open House Fall Festival

Open to the entire community, the event featured hands-on student demonstrations from a variety of the vocational programs offered at the school, including: Baking and Pastry Arts, Diversified Hospitality and Food Services.

Among the special demonstrations were meat-cutting techniques, charcuterie (the French tradition of preparing meats, especially pork, in diverse ways) and floral design. Several Golightly chefs and parents participated in hands-on classroom demonstrations of healthy meal preparation.
